## A MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR:

Dear Friends,

“Alleluia, Christ is risen. He is risen indeed, alleluia.” It seems like we have waited a long time to proclaim that wondrous moment that changed and is changing the world and those of us who seek to follow the Lord. God has done great things for us, and we are glad indeed.

I give thanks to God for the gift of this past Lent and the path we have travelled together. I am most grateful for the ministries of Dean Peggy, Deacon James, Mark Childers, and the many, many people that worked so hard so that we may grow deeper in our relationship to our Lord, Jesus. The ministries of our altar and flower guild, choir, acolytes, lay readers, ushers, hospitality group; children’s ministry, those people who participated in our classes, special services, and every other aspect of our parish ministry, moves me greatly. Without your dedication, Holy Faith would not be the truly extraordinary place that it is.



Although this is the April Newsletter, I do want to tell you about two days in June and hope that you can “save the dates” and be with us. The first is the Bishop’s Annual Visitation which will take place on Sunday, June 2. Bishop Vono will be with us at both the 8:30 am and 11:00 am services. He will celebrate, preach, confirm, and address the Forum. We will be offering a special class for those who wish to consider confirmation in the Episcopal Church. It also serves as an introduction to the history and worship of the Church and provides an opportunity to ask questions about the Church. The class will meet on Friday, May 31 from 6:00-9:00 pm, and on Saturday, June 1 from 9:00 am-3:00 pm. Should you wish to learn more about the class, please speak with me or call the office to sign up. Since lunch is served on Saturday, we will need to have a count.

It is always a joy to have Bishop Michael with us and he will be with us again on the evening of June 11, the Feast of St. Barnabas, when, along with Bishop Gregory Brewer, Bishop of Central Florida, Deacon James Brzezinski will be ordained priest. Though Deacon James has been with us only a brief while, among other things I have come to appreciate his special gifts for prayer and encouragement and I know all of us who have come to know him, have come to love him. How appropriate that he should be made a priest on St. Barnabas’ Day: Barnabas means “son of encouragement.” The entire parish will be invited to celebrate and join in this special event. More information will be forthcoming.

We now enter the Fifty Days of Easter. It is a special time of joy and our liturgy will reflect that in our music, vestments, and celebration. Having worked through the Lenten season, we now celebrate the glorious resurrection of our Lord, Jesus, who has broken the bonds of sin and death.

## WOMEN'S SPIRITUALITY GATHERING ON HILDEGARD OF BINGEN: RENAISSANCE WOMAN FOR EVERY AGE

Dean Peggy Patterson will offer a five-week series on *Hildegard of Bingen: Renaissance Woman for Every Age* on Wednesdays, April 24, and May 1, 8, 15, and 22, from 3:00-4:30 pm in the Kinsolving Room in Conkey House. We will discuss and experience Hildegard of Bingen's fascinating life as an eleventh century Benedictine Abbess in Germany.

Hildegard of Bingen was called by God as a young girl and was raised in a monastic community from the age of eight. She later had incredible visions which she shared in her writings. Hildegard's writings impressed both the Pope and the Benedictine founder, Bernard. She was a woman who saw God's creation as a gift, who received the Holy Spirit's Illuminations, and wrote them down for others to share. She created in art and music a living legacy, even for our day. We will hear Hildegard's music, create our own Mandala's, and talk about her intriguing images of God.

Two resources will be used: *Illuminations of Hildegard of Bingen* by Matthew Fox (smaller edition) and *Praying with Hildegard of Bingen* by Gloria Durka.
