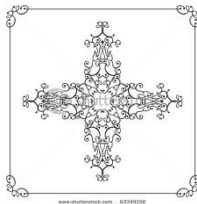
In our vestry meetings for the past two months or so, we have been discussing the lighting challenges in the church as well as the dated electrical wiring. As we look into the possibilities of reconfiguring and updating our electrical situation, it would be easy to include the gift shop space and reconfigure it to best show the works of our parish artists.

Several people have asked me recently about the three study groups I work with each week. On Tuesdays from 10:00-11:00 am we have a “spiritual classics” reading group. After a brief time of silent prayer, we discuss various books having to do with prayer and the spiritual life. Presently we are reading Brother David Steindl-Rast’s book, *Gratefulness, The Heart of Prayer*. We will be concluding that study in a week or two. We next plan to read a book on the prologue to the Rule of St. Benedict by Michael Casey, *The Road to Eternal Life*. The class is open and meets in the Campbell Room.

On Wednesdays at 3:00 pm in the Youth Room and Thursdays at 10:00 am in the Campbell Room, I facilitate Bible Studies for men and women respectively. The groups meet for an hour and presently are reading the great prophet, Isaiah. Everyone is free to join in on the study and discussion. In each group we are about one third of the way through the book. Should you have any questions, please feel free to contact me.

In May we come to the close of the Great Fifty Days. I hope they have been as joyous for you as they have been for me.

HOLY FAITH WOMEN'S SPIRITUALITY PILGRIMAGE TO CHARTRES CATHEDRAL AND PARIS

The Very Reverend Peggy Patterson will lead a small Women's Spirituality Pilgrimage to Chartres Cathedral and Paris on September 14-23, 2013. The group of 12-15 will participate in a four day Veriditas Conference at Chartres, led by The Reverend Dr. Lauren Artress, Honorary Canon of Chartres Cathedral, and for twenty years, a Canon at Grace Cathedral. She is the author of *Walking the Sacred Path: Rediscovering the Labyrinth as a Spiritual Tool*, and has been credited with reintroducing the ancient medieval Notre Dame Cathedral in Chartres to contemporary pilgrims.

The group will have daily seminars with Dr. Artress, liturgies and meditations in the Cathedral, and will explore the ancient icons of Mary: Our Lady of the Pillar (*the Black Madonna*), the *Notre Dame sous Terre* (in the crypt), and *the Blue Virgin* Stained Glass Window. One evening the Pilgrims will have a private, candlelight labyrinth walk in Chartres Cathedral, including live music and a pilgrim's walk through the crypt. Days will include meals at various Cafés on the plaza, exploring the quaint medieval village, and evenings at the Maison St. Yves where the group will stay.

The Pilgrimage also includes four days and nights in Paris, including visits to cultural and religious monuments, Vespers at Notre Dame, and informal time to explore Paris.

There will be an introductory meeting on Wednesday, May 1, at 5:00 pm in the Kinsolving Room to learn more about the Pilgrimage. Please call Dean Peggy at 982-4447, ext. 119 to let her know to expect you. Travel arrangements are being made by Journeys Unlimited Travel and Veriditas.
