A MESSAGE FROM THE RECTOR:

Dear Friends,

We are on the verge of the celebration of our 150 years as the Episcopal Church in Santa Fe. The festivities will begin with a parish picnic at Camp Stoney on Saturday, October 5 beginning at 4pm. On Sunday we will have a special liturgy and music to celebrate the Feast of St. Francis, our patron, as well as a special breakfast between the 8:30 and 11:00 services. Our docents will be available for tours of the church that morning and then, in the afternoon, we will continue the celebration with the Blessing of the Animals. Other special events will be scheduled throughout our year of celebration.

Often people will ask, "How may I serve the parish?" or "Where do you need help in the ministries of the church?" There are several opportunities that are in special need of your ministry at this time: our movie nights have been very successful and a great deal of fun and we need someone or a group of people to



coordinate the continuation of that ministry. Secondly, we need someone or a group to coordinate our ministry at the Interfaith Homeless Shelter. We have been active in the work of the shelter since it began six years ago and I believe we should continue in our support, financially and physically. We have had over one hundred volunteers each year and we need someone to step forward to coordinate the two weeks we volunteer to serve at the shelter. Lastly, we need someone or a group to step forward and take responsibility for the first Sunday of the Month breakfast in December, February, April, June, and August.

As we look back to 150 years of worship in Santa Fe, we have so much to give thanks for. Often I will enter the church building and find myself admiring the beauty of what has been provided for us: Holy Faith is such a beautiful worship space. Recently, one of visitors was leaving and said of our worship, "The choir is excellent, but as I sang with the congregation standing in the Nave, I felt like I was in the midst of the choir!" I am constantly encouraged and edified by our worship and the various classes I facilitate. The spiritual depth of the conversation and questions reminds me weekly of our mission statement, that we are growing into an ever deepening relationship with Jesus Christ our Lord.

I give thanks to God, most of all, for you and for your faithfulness. I pray that God will continue to raise up people to lead in the various ministries of the parish.

HOLY FAITH WOMEN'S SPIRITUALITY PILGRIMAGE TO CHARTRES AND PARIS

SEPTEMBER 14-23, 2013

Twelve women will accompany Dean Peggy Patterson on a Pilgrimage to France to study the long history of the Spirituality of Mary in the life and art and worship of Chartres Cathedral. The group will spend four days and nights in the small medieval village of Chartres at the monastic seminary next to the Cathedral. They will also study and experience the ancient Chartres Labyrinth, walked by so many Pilgrims through the ages. The Chartres Conference will be led by The Reverend Dr. Lauren Artress, retired Canon of Grace Cathedral and Honorary Canon of Chartres Cathedral.

The group will then travel to Paris for a tour of the many Churches there, including Vespers at Notre Dame Cathedral, a tour of St Chappelle, Mass at St. Sulpice with an organ concert on the largest organ in Paris, and a tour of the three oldest churches in the St. Germain district.

On Monday, September 9, the Pilgrimage Group will attend Evening Prayer together at 4:30 pm in the Chapel. The group will receive a Blessing from the Rector for their Pilgrimage.

NEW BEREAVEMENT GROUP FORMING

MINISTRY AND OUTREACH COMMITTEE PRESENTS VISION EN ACCION

Vision En Accion of Juarez, Mexico, has caught the true spirit of Saint Francis, the patron saint of Santa Fe and the namesake of our church. On September 15th the Mission and Outreach Committee has invited Morgan Smith, a Santa Fe resident and liaison to Vision in Action to present a slide show and a movie trailer describing the work in Juarez.

Several years ago, Jose Antonio Galavan, the founder, had experienced difficulties in his own life and though not well educated, saw the need for serving the mentally challenged and disenfranchised of Juarez, Mexico. Many of these people



came from other communities and were living on the streets of this large city. Unable to provide for themselves, Galavan gathered clothing, medicine and food for them. He preached words of hope and of God's love to them.

Although there are no provisions to cover the mentally challenged in an emerging economy like Mexico, the government did provide two industrial-sized washing machines for their use. Often the washing machines are not in working order so the people of the institution wash their own blankets and clothing. They lay the blankets and clothing on the bushes to dry in the surrounding area. This is done several times per week.

Through a book that was written by Charles Bowden on Juarez, Mexico, and translated into Italian, the needs of Vision En Accion were met by a group of Italians. They provided \$70,000.00 to build two large buildings; one for women and one for the men with small dwellings in between. These private dwellings are for those who are unable to fit socially among the general population.

The needs are great, servicing about one hundred individuals. The current pressing need is to provide funds for bunk beds for the men, blankets, metal mirrors and the cost of gas to collect food from the local food banks in the area.

On Thursdays, you can opt to come at 6:00-6:30 am to fill the bags with the remaining perishable items like fresh eggs and fruit and potatoes.
