For the famine has been in the land these two years; and there are five more years in which there will be neither plowing nor harvest. God sent me before you to preserve for you a remnant on earth, and to keep alive for you many survivors. Second Reading

1 Corinthians 15:35-38,42-50

Someone will ask, "How are the dead raised? With what kind of body do they come?" Fool! What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. And as for what you sow, you do not sow the body that is to be, but a bare seed, perhaps of wheat or of some other grain. But God gives it a body as he has chosen, and to each kind of seed its own body. So it is with the resurrection of the dead. What is sown is perishable, what is raised is imperishable. It is sown in dishonor, it is raised in glory. It is sown in weakness, it is raised in power. It is sown a physical body, it is raised a spiritual body. If there is a physical body, there is also a spiritual body. Thus it is written, "The first man, Adam, became a living being"; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. But it is not the spiritual that is first, but the physical, and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven. As was the man of dust, so are those who are of the dust; and as is the man of heaven, so are those who are of heaven. Just as we have borne the image of the man of dust, we will also bear the image of the man of heaven. What I am saying, brothers and sisters, is this: flesh and blood cannot inherit the kingdom of God, nor does the perishable inherit the imperishable.

Introduction and Responsive Reading of The Scout Oath

(11:00 a.m. only)

Scouts **On my honor, I will do my best...**

Celebrant Honor is a quality you possess because of your dignity as human beings and children of God. Your 'best' means to give all you have. It means to keep striving to do what you know is right, and in the Oath it means you will try to be good Scouts by fulfilling your Scout duties as expressed in the Scout Law.

Scouts **To do my duty to God and my country, and to obey the Scout Law...**

Celebrant Your duty to God and country means chiefly two things: obedience and loyalty. The duties you owe to the church, to your country, to parents, to one another, and to yourselves come from the Word of God. The Scout Law sums up all the qualities Scouts should have and without which they can not be good Scouts.

Scouts **To help other people at all times...**

Celebrant Jesus told us the first and most important law is to love the Lord with all your heart; the second is to love your neighbor as yourself. Early Christians were known by the love they had for one another. Real Christian charity or love prompts us to want to help others at all times. Your Scout training will give you skills and knowledge that will put you in a better position to do this.

Scouts **To keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight.**

Celebrant Through your regular Scouting activities you have many opportunities to grow physically. To be alert and ready means that you have to give special care to the two gifts of soul and will that make you more like God. "Morally Straight" means you must try to know what is right and true, and to love what is good and choose it.

Celebrant Let us pray.

O Lord, without whom our labor is lost: We beseech you to prosper all works in your Church undertaken according to your holy will. Grant to these scouts a pure intention, a patient faith, sufficient success on earth, and the blessedness of serving you in heaven; and the blessing of God Almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you, and remain with you always. *Amen.*

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, we thy people do celebrate and make, with these thy holy gifts which we now offer unto thee, the memorial thy Son hath commanded us to make; having in remembrance his blessed passion and precious death, his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; and looking for his coming again with power and great glory.

And we most humbly beseech thee, O merciful Father, to hear us, and, with thy Word and Holy Spirit, to bless and sanctify these gifts of bread and wine, that they may be unto us the Body and Blood of thy dearly-beloved Son Jesus Christ.

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, whereby we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies. Grant, we beseech thee, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; and also that we and all thy whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord;

If you do not wish to receive Communion, you may cross your arms over your chest to receive a blessing.

Children who have been baptized may receive according to the discretion of their parents.
