The Lord said to Moses, "Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshiped it and sacrificed to it, and said, 'These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" The Lord said to Moses, "I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation."

But Moses implored the Lord his God, and said, "O Lord, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? Why should the Egyptians say, 'It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth'? Our priests are happy to do so for you and place the wafer on your tongue.

If this is your preference, please keep your hands folded as a sign to the priest to give you Communion in this manner.

If you do not wish to receive Communion, you may cross your arms over your chest to receive a blessing.

Children who have been baptized may receive according to the discretion of their parents.

From Your Treasurer

Holy Faith is extraordinarily blessed to benefit from an endowment that supports our work within the parish and our beloved community. We speak often of 'The Endowment' but it's worth noting that 'The Endowment' is actually eight different endowed funds each supporting specific ministries and purposes. Disbursements from each endowed fund is limited to 4% of the average year-end market value of the invested funds for the previous three years and can only be used for its specific dedicated purpose. The original endowment, established in 1977 with the Article VI amendment to the by-laws, is currently made up of three different endowed funds: the Scheffler Mission & Outreach Fund, the Scheffler Women's Guild Fund, and the Main Endowment Fund. Caroline Scheffler's generous bequest was the start of the first two funds. Today, both the Mission and Outreach Committee and the Women's Guild use disbursements to award grants to non-profits in Santa Fe and beyond. Disbursements from the Main Endowment Fund generally offset the cost of capital projects. Over the past several years the fund has underwritten the expense of air conditioning the sanctuary, new roofing on Conkey House, a new heating system throughout the campus, and foundation remediation on the garden side of the sanctuary.

Article VI only allows endowed funds to be directed for non-operating purposes.

In 2019, parishioners amended the by-laws by adding Article VII to create an opportunity for donors to endow funds for additional purposes including operating. Since then, four endowed funds have been established: the Lewis-Wiley fund supporting the book scholarship ministry, the Simms Children's Fund supporting children and youth ministries, the Hinson-Rasmussen Fund supporting the music ministries, and the Operations Fund which provides ongoing support towards operating costs. In addition, the parish honored Caroline Scheffler's legacy by placing the Scheffler Library Fund in the Article VII bundle in order to support the ongoing costs of our library. The next chat will review how the endowment is invested and managed. As always, if you have any questions, concerns, or suggestions, please feel free to contact me or any member of your Vestry.
