Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. The next day he took out two denarii, gave them to the innkeeper, and said, 'Take care of him; and when I come back, I will repay you whatever more you spend.' Which of these three, do you think, was a neighbor to the man who fell into the hands of the robbers?" He said, "The one who showed him mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

And we earnestly desire thy fatherly goodness to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, whereby we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, our selves, our souls and bodies. Grant, we beseech thee, that all who partake of this Holy Communion may worthily receive the most precious Body and Blood of thy Son Jesus Christ, and be filled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; and also that we and all thy whole Church may be made one body with him, that he may dwell in us, and we in him; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord;

Regarding Communion

To receive wine, you may sip from the chalice. You may also decline the chalice, as Communion in one kind constitutes a full Communion.

Please do not place the wafer in the wine yourself.

Our priests are happy to do so for you and place the wafer on your tongue.

If this is your preference, please keep your hands folded as a sign to the priest to give you Communion in this manner.

If you do not wish to receive Communion, you may cross your arms over your chest to receive a blessing.

Children who have been baptized may receive according to the discretion of their parents.

Adult Forum July 13th: Spotlight on The Sky Center & Interfaith Shelter

We have two presenters this Sunday:

<u>The Sky Center</u>/New Mexico Suicide Intervention Project has been a Holy Faith Mission & Outreach grant recipient since 2018. Their mission is to meet the challenge of youth suicide in Santa Fe and Northern New Mexico. New Mexico has one of the highest youth suicide rates in the nation and the need for services is immense.

<u>Interfaith Community Shelter Group</u> has been a grant recipient since 2013, and Holy Faith is one of its founding members. We have supported the Shelter in numerous ways since its founding.
