The Lord appeared to Abraham by the oaks of Mamre, as he sat at the entrance of his tent in the heat of the day. He looked up and saw three men standing near him. When he saw them, he ran from the tent entrance to meet them, and bowed down to the ground. He said, "My lord, if I find favor with you, do not pass by your servant. Let a little water be brought, and wash your feet, and rest yourselves under the tree. Let me bring a little bread, that you may refresh yourselves, and after that you may pass on-- since you have come to your servant." So they said, "Do as you have said." He himself is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church; he is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, so that he might come to have first place in everything. For in him all the fullness of God was pleased to dwell, and through him God was pleased to reconcile to himself all things, whether on earth or in heaven, by making peace through the blood of his cross.

And you who were once estranged and hostile in mind, doing evil deeds, he has now reconciled in his fleshly body through death, so as to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before him-provided that you continue securely established and steadfast in the faith, without shifting from the hope promised by the gospel that you heard, which has been proclaimed to every creature under heaven. I, Paul, became a servant of this gospel.

I am now rejoicing in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am completing what is lacking in Christ's afflictions for the sake of his body, that is, the church. I became its servant according to God's commission that was given to me for you, to make the word of God fully known, the mystery that has been hidden throughout the ages and generations but has now been revealed to his saints. To them God chose to make known how great among the Gentiles are the riches of the glory of this mystery, which is Christ in you, the hope of glory. It is he whom we proclaim, warning everyone and teaching everyone in all wisdom, so that we may present everyone mature in Christ.

If you do not wish to receive Communion, you may cross your arms over your chest to receive a blessing.

Children who have been baptized may receive according to the discretion of their parents.

Adult Forum July 20th: Spotlight on Bag n' Hand and Resolve

We have two presenters this Sunday:

Bag n' Hand Food Pantry has been a Holy Faith Mission & Outreach grant recipient since 2020. Spearheaded by St. John's United Methodist Church, Bag n' Hand provides food in a friendly, non-judgmental environment to Santa Feans with food insecurity. Each week 30-50 volunteers distribute food boxes to 185-225 households. Several Holy Faith parishioners have assisted with this ministry.

Resolve has been a grant recipient since 2019. Resolve's mission is to prevent violence by building skills and inspiring individuals to be agents of personal, community, and cultural change. Resolve teaches violence prevention skills to youth and adults in Santa Fe, Albuquerque, and Northern New Mexico.

All Adult forums are from 10:00 – 10:45 a.m. in Palen Hall.
